One of the items we were blessed to purchase was 8 rolls of Early Hot Spring County Newspapers and the Hot Spring County Marks & Brands Book. They are listed below. Hot Spring County Marks & Brands Book, 1830-1940 The Arkansas Times-Malvern, February 20, 1892-July 19, 1899; The Times Journal-Malvern, January 4, 1905-August 4, 1909; The Times Journal-Malvern, August 11, 1909-August 28, 1913; The Times Journal-Malvern, September 4, 1913-March 8, 1917; Malvern Times Journal-Malvern, March 8, 1917-October 6, 1921; Malvern Daily Record, January 13, 1920-January 31, 1921; Malvern Daily Record, February 1, 1921-May 5, 1922.
