The oil painting of "The Rockport Mill" by Paralee (Lee) Buckner Maddry, believed to have been painted in the late 1880s, was recently donated to the HSCHS by her family. Family members say the painting is a representation of the Ouachita Falls Lumber Co sawmill that was located on the east bank of the Ouachita river at the Tanner Street Bridge crossing at Rockport. Mary Overton-Petrarca of Springdale,

her son Frank Petrarca of Indiana, and other family members delivered the painting to the HSCHS Heritage Building on September 12, 2016. After the donation, they viewed the mill site on the river. The painting is available for viewing by the public from 10 until 2 on Fridays or by appointment. It will be featured on the cover of the 2016 HERITAGE.

2016 H8CH8 Meeting Highlights

January 2016

Former students of Bismarck High School, Miki Fendley and Sarah Smith were our January 2016 speakers. They spoke about the Bismarck Proiect, a book of local history and photos from Bismarck and the surrounding communities. Their project came about through a grant from the Ross Foundation. Nine students, with guidance and supervision of the Bismarck High School librarian, reached out to the communities for history, photos and interviews. The response from the communities was overwhelming and the result was a history book of which those involved and the School District can be proud.

February 2016

Jerry Whatley shared the history and numerous vintage photos of the Lono community and its people. These included the CCC camp, the Lono School, and various farm houses. He spoke about the Elliots, Whatleys, Tankersleys and others. Mr. Whatley's presentation was well received by those in attendance

April 2016

Five students from the Malvern Schools EAST Lab presented about the EAST program, their current projects and plans. The information presented was well organized and informative.

May 2016

Lance Howell. Executive Director of the Malvern/Hot Spring County Chamber of Commerce brought a journal containing the original handwritten minutes from the founding of the Malvern Chamber of Commerce in 1916. Also included was a list of 78 charter members of the Chamber. Photocopies of minutes from the founding on September 5, 1916 through April 2, 1918 as well as the list of charter members were placed in the HSCHS Library.

June 2016

The June meeting was held at the Bismarck Elementary School. The program was presented by Doug Green of Bismarck. Many historical artifacts and photos of the Bismarck community were provided for viewing. Doug gave an excellent talk on the

history of the area that included discussions on crops grown over the years, area schools, WWII veterans, and the origin of the name of Bismarck.

September 2016

Orval Allbritton gave a presentation on shootouts between gamblers in both Malvern and Hot Springs, Arkansas. Mr. Allbritton is the author of several books set in Hot Springs, including The Mob at the Spa and Hot Springs Gunsmoke. His program described the movement of some gamblers between Hot Springs and Malvern as well as the use of state troops to remove them from Malvern.

October 2016

The October program was presented by Dr. Wendy Richter of Ouachita Baptist University. Her program discussed the Hunter-Dunbar expedition that explored the Ouachita River in 1804-1805. The expedition was one of three expeditions commissioned to explore the Louisiana Territory by President Thomas Jefferson. A corollary expedition was that of Lewis and Clark on the

Missouri River. The presentation included a display of William Dunbar's handwritten expedition ledger. Other artifacts displayed included Dunbar's eyeglasses, tweezers, pen, and compass, believed to have been used during the expedition. All artifacts are archived at the OBU library.
